

Business Performance Indicators

- Over ¾ don't have a plan
- o Almost 90% don't have "goal-posts for that plan"
- o Almost all GIS sites report not being understood



Pragmatic Views of the Spatial Industry

Two take-home messages:

- 1. Stop focusing on the technology and start focusing on the business
- 2. Stop focusing on the need to have a Internal Champion

That is, focus on the business – not the hammers in the tool-box
