Sustainability – What does it mean?

- □ Economics;
- □ Society;
- □ Environment natural and built;
- □ Resources;
- May be about Growth?
- □ Definitely about quality of life now and in the future.

Sustainable Property Tax – what could that mean?

- Sustainable outcomes for taxable property;
- □ Sustainable tax system efficiency;
- □ Sustainable local services, which support;
- Sustainable communities.

Sustainable tax objects

- □ Tax should encourage sustainable use(s) of land and buildings;
- □ Optimisation of use of buildings / land;
- 'Fairness' between taxpayers (horizontal and vertical equity);
- May perceived to be different across range of societies.

Sustainability of tax itself

- □ A "good" property tax e.g.:
 - Confidence of taxpaying public;
 - Transparent, cheap and efficient;
 - Support taxable values of land and buildings;
 - Ensure tax base is frequently updated; but
 - Don't assume that all such characteristics are "sustainable".



Sustainability of tax itself

- Reflect on "sustainable" nature of each characteristic in respect to needs and values of local society;
- □ Taxing of a necessity;
- □ Should reflect ability to pay.

Sustainable Services

- □ Sufficient yield to provide funds for range and level of services;
- Services should contribute to sustainability of local communities:
 - Maintenance and improvement of value / attraction of land and buildings;
 - Achieve buoyancy of yield;
 - Increase 'attractiveness' of local community.



Conclusions

- □ Longevity does that mean sustainable?
- □ Property taxes are not generic;
- Sustainable property taxes must reflect local society's:
 - Needs,
 - Aspirations;
 - Resources.
